

Through this endeavour, the discipline can claim to be practical and useful. Multiple perspectives from diverse fields of psychology would help in providing us with solutions which are not far removed from reality. The challenge before us is to move beyond a deficient model to a holistic one in order to help the discipline to become more pragmatic and growth oriented.

The broad NAOP divisions (Cognitive, Developmental, Health, Indian, Military, Organizational Behaviour and Human Resource Management, Psychological Assessment, Social Psychology, Social Issues and Development), you wish your abstract to be included, should also be mentioned. Indicate the form of presentation (ORAL/POSTER). Use 12-point Times New Roman font for the text with single line spacing without indentations.

Proposals for Symposium should include one abstract of the Symposium proposal and maximum of 4 abstracts of individual presentations in the symposium.
