BOG – 8 (2005) – 1: Welcome to the members (including new members) and invitees by the Chairman.

- (iii) Representation of Dr. B.K. Pal dated October 04, 2005 was discussed in the Board. Board decided to abide by its previous decision that Dr. B. K. Pal does not satisfy the requirements for CAS promotion for the post of professor.

BOG – 8 (2005) – 8: Change of option from CPF to Pension scheme as decided by 6th Finance Committee held on 25th May 2005.

As per the decision of the 7th Finance Committee Meeting vide resolution No. F.C.-7(2005)-2 representative of MHRD informed that no change over from CPF to GPF cum pension scheme is permissible in accordance with the instruction given by Ministry of Finance, Govt of India for which ministry has already issued a general circular in 2002. The representatives of MHRD were requested to send the said circular to NIT Rourkela for information.

BOG – 8 (2005) – 9: To discuss and approve Combination of Past Service for the employees of NIT Rourkela, who have served in other organizations and industries prior to their appointment in NIT.

The Board decided that the past service of employees of NIT, Rourkela could be combined following the rules of Govt of Orissa and Govt of India. The Representative of MHRD wanted a copy of the rules of Govt of Orissa in this regard to be sent to MHRD for final decision.

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√ BOG – 8 (2005) – 10: Payment of Overtime Allowance to Drivers and Bus Helpers on the basis of the letter received from MHRD vide No. F.12-8/2005-TS.III, dated – 11th August 2005.

As per the Central Government provisions Bus Drivers are entitled to Rs. 16.50 per hour subject to a maximum ceiling of 100 hours per month. The maximum ceiling of OTA, which can be sanctioned to Drivers, is 8 hours on holidays and 6 hours on working days. The Institute may also adopt above provisions while regulating the OTA to the Drivers and Bus Helpers. The Bus Helpers are also entitled for OTA on the similar scale as that of the Drivers. However, the Institute should discourage payment of OTA to their staff and if possible compensatory holiday may be granted for the work performed by them during holidays. Head of the Institute should keep a strict watch on grant of OTA to the staff and utmost economy should be maintained while granting OTA.

The Board approved the implementation of overtime rules for drivers as communicated by MHRD vide Circular No. F.12-8/2005-TS.III, dated – 11th August 2005.

√ BOG – 8 (2005) – 11: To approve the recommendation of minutes of 7th Meeting of Senate held on 25th January 2005 on Management Programme in collaboration with Indian Institute for Production Management (IIPM), Kansbahal.

(i)The Senate considered a proposal to offer a one year Post-Graduate Diploma in Management in collaboration with Indian Institute for Production Management (IIPM), Kansbahal. Prof. B.K.Nanda, Professor and Head, Department of Mechanical Engineering is appointed as Co-ordinator from NIT side. The Senate recommended the proposal to BOG for approval.

The Board approved the proposal for one year post graduate diploma in management in collaboration with Indian Institute for Production Management(IIPM), Kansbahal. The details to be worked out in consultation with AICTE and MHRD.

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(ii) An MoU has been signed between NIT, RKL and IIPM, Kansbahal for offering a six-month programme on 'Advanced Diploma in Maintenance Management & Condition Monitoring'. The Programme has been started from 15th September 2005. Put up to the Board for kind information.

New purchase procedure was approved by Board resolution no. BOG-3 (2003) – 10 of 3rd Meeting of BOG held on 9th October 2003. A new guideline has been received from MHRD vide letter No. F.20-13/2004-TS-III, Dated 22nd August 2005, to modify the purchase procedure as per GFR, Government of India. We may appoint a consultant (CAG approved auditor) to frame new purchase rules. Board may kindly approve.

The Board approved the appointment of one consultant for modification of purchase procedures as per GFR, Government of India. The new purchase procedures should be put up for approval in the next BOG meeting.

✓BOG – 8 (2005) – 14: To discuss and approve the Teaching and Non-Teaching personnel recruitment and TA rules under TEQIP cell.

(1)The Board noted the advertisement of recruitment of teaching and non-teaching personnel under TEQIP and the selection process should be completed as per institute rules. (2)TA/DA rules will be followed as approved vide finance committee resolution No F.C.-7(2005)-7. Since TEQIP is a project the Institute SRICCE rules for TA/DA will be applicable.

- (3) TA/DA Rules for attending training programme and conference under TEQIP
- A) Training and paper presentation inside the country TEQIP will meet the following expenses

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- 1. Travel by air or rail (AC II tier) as applicable.
- 2.100% registration fee or training fee as applicable.
- 3.Hotel accommodation expenses as per institute SRICCE norms.
- 4.DA as per institute norms.
- 5. Other travel expenses as per actual.
- B) Paper presentation abroad

TEQIP will bear all expenses as per actual, not exceeding Rs. 100,000/- (Rupees One lakh Only). The following conditions will be applicable.

- i.100% registration fee will be borne by TEQIP.
- ii.DA will be paid @ US \$75/- (Seventy five USD) per day (This will be limited to the conference period+2days for travel).
- iii.100% visa processing fee.
- •iv.Cost towards return air travel from India to place of conference by Indian Airlines/ Air India only. (Incase travel by any other airline, a certificate stating that such flights are not available or tickets for scheduled journey is not available from Air India authorities only must be produced for reimbursement.)
- v.Airfare or 2nd AC train fare (as applicable) to and from international airport will be paid.
- vi. Any other transport as per actual will be aid by TEQIP.
- vii.A faculty is permitted to present two different papers in two consecutive conferences where the duration of stay from beginning of first conference to end of second conference is limited to 10days. The total expenses payable will be limited to Rs. 100,000/-(Rupees One Lakh Only).
- C) Training abroad (Training abroad in Advanced Labs and on Management)

All clauses as stipulated in (B) above shall apply with following modifications

i.No registration fee shall be paid for training in Advanced Laboratories.



- ii.For management training the training fee may be paid as per actual.
- iii. The total expenses payable for the training shall be limited to Rs. 1,50,000/-(One lakh fifty thousand Only).
- iv. The total stay including the journey should be limited to 15days.
- v.If a faculty likes to attend a conference to present paper in a conference adjoining a training program he/ she can do so subjected to minimum one week of training and total period of stay limited to 2 weeks.
- vi.In above case the travel should be executed with single return air ticket with a stop over either during onward or return journey.

Note: In case a person receives any financial assistance from other sources, TEQIP will only bear the differential amount as per the limits mentioned above for both paper presentation and training abroad.

4.Partial financial assistance for conducting conference / seminar/ workshop at NIT, Rourkela

Following expenses will be paid by TEQIP

- i) Rs10, 000/-(Rupees ten thousand only) as financial assistance for printing of proceedings and brochure.
- ii) TA/DA expenses for two exerts by AC-II rail fare.
- iii) Accommodation and food charges for institute guesthouse.

As intentionally I was debarred (I was selected for promotion to the level of Assistant Professor as per my interview held on 06.06.1995 and the result was passed in the BOG meeting held on 05.12.1995) from that so I filed in the Hon'ble High Court, Orissa the OJC No. 15559/1998 and subsequently withdrew it as per office order No.RECR/RD/3348 dated 21.05.2002 vide Misc Case No.3902/2002 when I was in wining stage. Please let me know from which date I am getting this placement. The detailed information regarding my eligibility and service is highlighted in my representation dated 10.06.2003.
- I appeared for interview for the post of Professor on 30.12.2003 and made the queries vide my representations dated 31.03.2004, 06.05.2005, 20.05.2005, 27.07.2005, 27.09.2005. I received your Memo No. NITR/Estt/8785 dated 04.10.2005 that the Board has noted that I am not satisfying the requirement for CAS promotion for the post of Professor. With due respect, I want to request you to please review my earlier letters. In my letter dated 27.07.05, I have explained in details regarding my victimization which I am facing since my joining in this College/Institute. In this regard you have telephonically informed me on 29.07.05 that you will discuss with me regarding this issue. Though around two months are going to be elapsed, you have not given any time to me for discussion. Kindly do the needful at your end to iron out my mental agony.

It is observed from the statistics regarding the promotions held in this Institutes that many a place Institute has violated the norms to give the unwanted benefit to the Teachers, viz. without Ph.D. persons have been promoted to the level of Professor, without any working experience as Assistant Professor persons have been promoted to the level of Professor, without proper experience and qualification persons have been promoted to the level of Assistant Professor etc.. Even while implementing the pay revision as per the 5th Pay Commission, persons have got the pay fixation at a very higher rate which was direct violation of the Pay Fixation Rules. Whereas, the Institute is always trying to violate the norms to debar me from the legal dues so that I should be looser and carry the mental agony. In this connection, I want to request you to kindly give the justice to me because the authority has already accepted that Injustice is done on me (which is noted in my personal file). Though it is also mentioned there that it can not be rectified still I want to request you to kindly make the necessary rectification and give the proper justice to me. Otherwise, permit me to revive my Court Case (OJC No. 15559/1998) which I subsequently withdrew (as per RECR/RD/3348, dt. 21.05.02) conditionally vide Misc. Case No. 3902/2002. Waiting for your kind reply at the earliest. If no reply is received from your end by 06.10.2005 (Thursday) I shall assume that the Institute has no objection if I challenge the above points in the Hon'ble Court.

Report on Cyber misuse by some students of National Institute of Technology, Rourkela

- 1. A case of a Cyber misuse was reported at NIT, Rourkela on 4 February 2005. The misuse was in the form of an e-mail circulation. This e-mail was circulated on 4 February 2005 to students of B. Tech II (presently 5th semester B. Tech). A copy of this was obtained by Dr. S. K. Patra, Faculty I/C, Campus Networking. This forged e-mail seemed to be sent by the name of a girl student of 4th semester (Presently 5th semester). This contained derogatory remarks about the above said girl student. The then Director had asked Dr. S.K.Patra to investigate the matter.
- 2. The investigation by Dr.S.K. Patra revealed that the said mail was sent by a forged person from a mail service provider called http:// www. fakemailz.com.
- 3. As per Dr. Patra's report, he had contacted fakemailz.com in this regard and was informed by fakemailz.com that the said forged mail was sent from their website by a user, named Abinandhan P with mail id. abinandhan86@ yahoo.com. The mail had originated from Institute campus (considering the originating IP as 203.129.199.147). It had been ascertained that this mail id belonged to Mr. P. Abinandhan, Roll No. 10307033 (Presently in 5th semester).
- 4. Dr. S.K.Patra's further investigation revealed that Mr. P. Abinanhan is the moderator of a yahoo group called "jalsaboys.yahoo.com". The owner of this yahoo group is J. Anand, Roll No. 10304037 (a 5th semester, student). It was discovered that on 28th December 2004, some one had circulated a morphed photograph of the same girl student in jalsaboys yahoo group. This morphed photo had face of the said girl student and body of a nude model. Dr. Patra has obtained a copy of this mail.
- 5. Based on report of Dr. S. K. Patra; Prof. S. K. Jena, Professor & Head, Computer Science and Engineering was asked to examine the documents and provide his opinion. As per expert opinion of Prof. Jena, disciplinary committee was asked to proceed with disciplinary proceedings.
- 6. The disciplinary committee met on 12.04.2005 where, Prof. Jena and Dr. Patra were also invited. The Committee recommended:
 - 1. Sri J. Anand and Shri P. Abinandhan be expelled from Institute for their involvement in such a serious act of indiscipline.
 - 2. Their case may be handed over to CBI for further investigation.
- 7. Subsequently the parents/guardians of both students visited the institution and met members of the Disciplinary Committee, Dean (Students Affairs) and Director. Mr. Abinandan submitted documents to show that he had taken action to remove the email from jalsaboys.yahoo.com. They also submitted undertaking

for not involving themselves in such cases in the future. Additionally the girl student involved also wrote to withdraw her complaint. However, there is no written complaint by the girl student.

- 8. Based on Chairman, Disciplinary Committee's report, Director had again referred the case to the Disciplinary Committee on 17.05.2005. The Disciplinary Committee met on 28th July 2005 (after nomination of student members) The Committee recommended the following:
 - 1. The Committee could neither prove nor disprove the involvement of the two students in circulation of said e-mail in the name of a girl student.

2.

- i. The two students have confessed to the fact that (i) Mr. J. Anand is the owner of the said mailing group "jalsaboys.yahoogroup.com" and Mr. P. Abinandan is the moderator.
- ii. That they were aware of such an email being circulated in the said yahoo group.
- iii. The said unsolicited mail even though contained a morphed photo of a girl student of our Institute, the owner nor the moderator, did not bring this to the notice of the authorities.
- 3. Based on the above facts the Committee recommends that, the case be put up before the HODs and Deans council for a final decision".
- 9. The Council of Deans & Heads in its meeting held on 1st September, 2005 authorised Director, Deans and Disciplinary Committee members (excluding student members) to take a decision in the matter.
- 10. The Committee of Director, Deans and members of Disciplinary Committee in its meeting held on 02.09.2005 made the following recommendations:

The Council of Deans and Institute Standing Disciplinary Committee on the basis of the majority opinion recommended that the following students be expelled for one year from the Institute as punishment for their act of indiscipline. They are how ever permitted to register for re-admission to the 5th semester in July, 2006.

Management committee deliberated on the above issue and it was decided that the possibility of accommodating her with some outsourcing agency depending on her qualification and competence will be explored. The house may be retained by her for one year with charges as per institute rules and procedure.

MC: 4 (2005) - 3: Re-imbursement of remuneration for Special Auditors.

On the recommendation of Chairman Board of Governors, NIT Rourkela, M/s Kumar Mittal & Co., Chartered Accountants, New Delhi conducted the special audit work. The Management Committee may take a suitable decision for re-imbursement of remuneration.

Discussion on matters arising out of the 5th Meeting of the Finance Committee.

Conversion from CPF to Pension for N.I.T. employees.

There have been the following changes in the last few years

- i) REC (Formerly under Govt. of Orissa and MHRD, Govt. of India) has been converted to NIT Rourkela (under MHRD, Govt. of India w.e.f 26.05.2002)
- ii) Calculation of pension is based on the actual age of retirement instead of 58 years.
- iii) Commutation value for pension has been increased from 33% to 40%.

In view of the above, about 22 employees have applied conversion from CPF to Pension scheme. As per the decision of the last Finance Committee, Director had written to MHRD for consideration. As a one time measure we may approve the above conversion.

In view of the above changes in the last few years, it was decided in principle to allow the conversion from CPF to Pension for the applicants as a on-time measure. However, MHRD clearance should be obtained before implementation.

F.C-6 (2005)-4:

Discussion on Plan and Non-Plan Budget allocation for the financial year 2005 – 2006.

The details of the plan and non-plan budget allocation for the financial year 2005-06 were discussed. Annexure - II

F.C-7 (2005)-6: Creation of Institute Development Fund.

At various times the Institute has deposited money in different Banks. It is proposed that instead of keeping the Institute fund in a distributed manner, we should create an Institute Development Fund and the following deposits will be credited to the same account.

- 1) Earning from SRICCE.
- 2) Collection from Students Development Fund.
- 3) Contribution from Alumni.
- 4) Donation from any other sources.

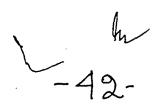
The above money should be deposited in a nationalized bank and slowly over a period of time the fund should grow to the tune of 100 crores.

The FC considered the need for having a Corpus Fund for the Institute keeping in view the need and future growth potential of the Institute. It was therefore decided that to create a Corpus Fund for the Institute from the current Financial Year by transferring the entire balance lying in the above mentioned accounts. The Corpus Fund would be managed in accordance with the guidelines issued by the Ministry in this regard.

F.C-7 (2005)-7: Re-imbursement of Lodging and Boarding charges during tour of NIT employees:

Faculty members, Officers and staff members of NIT Rourkela visit various Institute like IITs, NITs and other educational Institutes. Many a times they are deputed for official work with a short notice. As per our present rules they are entitled to lodging charges at the following rates (Annexure-III). It becomes difficult for the employees to adjust with such a low approved lodging charges. Therefore it is proposed as follows:

i) The employees should be allowed to stay in the Guest House of IITs, NITs and other educational Institutions and be permitted to reimburse the actual lodging and boarding charges.



ii) In other cities, the employees should be allowed to stay at Hotels and Guest Houses as per Institute SRICCE rules.

The FC considered the demand to amend the TA/DA rules for the employees of the Institute. It was decided that the Institute would follow the TA/DA rules as applicable to other Central Government employees. However, in case of sponsored Projects/TEQIP, the TA/DA rate would be as per guidelines prescribed for that project. It was further clarified that the Director of the Institute is competent to relax this in the same manner as contemplated under SR-52 of TA/DA Rules of the Central Government

iii) new employee joining in the Institute should be allowed to stay in the Guest House as Institute guest for the first three days.

Director being the Chief Executive of the Institute is competent to decide about all such cases, which are required for functional necessity.

F.C-7 (2005)-8:

It was pointed out by the Director that in the absence of a regular Accounts Officer, the Institute was finding it difficult to complete various account work including finalization of annual accounts in time. It was clarified by the representative of the Ministry of HRD that the Institute can fill up a post of Accounts Officer either on deputation basis or regular basis in the approved scale of the Central Government to meet the immediate need of the Institute.

1. ACCOUNTING CONVENTION

The financial statements are prepared on the basis of historical cost convention, unless otherwise stated and on the accrual method of accounting.

2. INVENTORY VALUATION

Stores and Spares are valued at cost.

Investments are valued at cost.

4. FIXED ASSETS

Fixed Assets are stated at cost of acquisition inclusive of inward expenses and incidental and direct expenses.

Fixed Assets acquired out of Earmarked/Endowment Funds being the assets of the Fund provider are deducted from the respective Fund Account as Capital expenditure & are not taken into Account in the Fixed Assets of the Institute shown under Schedule-8.

5. DEPRECIATION

Depreciation is provided on written down value method as per rates specified in the Income Tax Act; 1961.

6. GOVERNMENT GRANTS

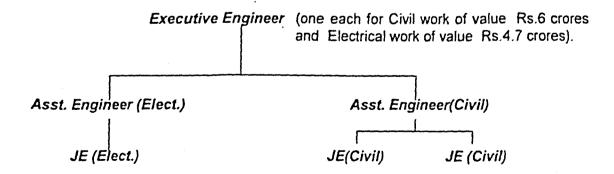

Misc. - National Institute of Technology, Rourkela (2005-2006) - Regarding enhancement of Rates of Over Time Allowance (OTA) to Drivers and Bus Helpers.

Sir,

I am directed to refer to your letter No.NITR/Estt./6179 dated 01.07.2005 on the subject mentioned above and to say that the matter has been examined in detail in this Department. After due examination, it has come to conclusion that a lump-sum amount of OTA should not be prescribed for Drivers and Bus Helpers, as suggested by the Institute in its letter mentioned above.

As per the Central Government provisions Bus Drivers are entitled to Rs.16.50 per hour subject to a maximum ceiling of 100 hours per month. The maximum ceiling of OTA, which can be sanctioned to Drivers, is 8 hours on holidays and 6 hours on working days. The Institute may also adopt above provisions while regulating the OTA to the Drivers and Bus Helpers. The Bus Helpers are also entitled for OTA on the similar scale as that of the Drivers. However, the Institute should discourage payment of OTA to their staff and if possible compensatory holiday may be granted for the work performed by them during holidays. Head of the Institute should keep a strict watch on grant of OTA to the staff and utmost economy should be maintained while granting OTA.

OFFICE MEMORANDUM

Subject:- Preparation of Purchase Rules by NITs & Delegation of Financial Powers - Guidelines regarding

The undersigned is directed to say that the Ministry of Finance Government of India has notified the General Financial Rules (GFR) -2005 vide OM No. 8/9/E.II(A)/2003 dated 1.7.2005. The Chapter No.6 & 7 of GFR-2005 provides detailed guidelines regarding Procurement of Goods & Services including Tender Procedures as well as Inventory Management. Besides, the Central Vigilance Commission has also issued certain guidelines regarding procurement procedures and tender. The GFR-2005 can be downloaded from http://www.finmin.nic.in while CVC instructions are available under http://cvc.nic.in

- NITs are advised to frame their own procurement procedures based on the above guidelines. The existing procurement procedures would need to be modified to the extent it is not in conformity with GFR-2005. The Rules so framed would have to be approved by the FC & BOG of the respective Institute. In fact, as a matter of rule, all major procurement proposals would be included in the annual budget of the Institute. NITs are also advised to browse the above-mentioned sites regularly for various updates on the subject matter. Alternatively, the NITs may also directly follow the provisions of GFR-2005 in matter of procurement and tender etc.
- As far as the delegation of Financial powers is concerned, the same should be decided keeping view the functional need of the Institute and the quantum of Financial Power in respect of various officers shall be decided by the respective FC&BOG. However, the power to write off losses shall be limited to amount as specified in the Delegation of Financial Power Rules 1978 in respect of the Head of the Department. This power would be excercised by the Director of the Institute only. Any amount above this limit shall be referred to the FC & BOG. While the Institute would be free to make its own purchase decisions within the allocated budget, the procurement mechanism shall not violate the general guidelines prescribed under GFR-2005. Rules can be relaxed in exceptional cases with the prior approval of the FC & BOG only.

CHAPTER - 5

TRAVEL & TRAVEL ADVANCE

The PI, CI and any other persons contributing to the project may travel anywhere in India to attend meetings, conferences or for paper presentation in conferences and seminars, for collecting data, technical discussion, or any work related to the project. They will be entitled for TA/DA as per Central Government rule if provision for such tours exists in the approved project budget. However, before proceeding for the tour they should have tour approved by Dean (SRIC) and Director and also has to apply for a tour advance. Both the tour approval and tour advance can be made in a single form (Annexure 22) and submit the same to SRIC cell. The approved TA advance will be considered as a temporary advance in the name of person who had applied for it. On completion of the tour, the advance has to be adjusted within 7 days of the resumption of the duty by submitting 7A claim form. for the tour (Annexure 23). It may be noted that as per Central Government rules, for railway travel in classes other than II or sleeper class, the original ticket or the ticket number has to be given with the TA claim form. For Air travel counterfoil of the ticket has to be attached along with the TA claim form. For approved tours, prepaid taxi fare or actual taxi fares charged for point to point transport may be reimbursed on production of receipts or certified statements by the PI. Central Government rules will be applicable for accommodation. However, in exigencies, accommodation in hotels with maximum rate of Rs. 1000/= per day in Metro cities and Rs. 600/= per day in other cities can be availed. The above accommodation can be reimbursed with the approval of Dean (SRIC)

2. TA RULES FOR ATTENDING TRAINING PROGRAM AND CONFERENCE UNDER TEQIP

A. Training and paper presentation inside the country

TEQIP will meet the following expenses

- i. Travel by air or rail (AC II tier) as applicable.
- ii. 100% registration fee or training fee as applicable.
- iii. Hotel accommodation expenses as per institute SRICCE norms.
- iv. DA as per institute norms.
- v. Other travel expenses as per actual.

B. Paper presentation Abroad

TEQIP will bear all expenses as per actual, not exceeding IR 100,000/-only. The following conditions will be applicable.

- i. 100% registration fee will be borne by the cell.
- ii. DA will be paid @ US \$75/- (per diem) per day (This will be limited to the conference period+2days for travel), as per norms of IITs and NPIU.
- iii. 100% visa processing fee.
- iv. Cost towards return air travel from India to place of conference by Indian Airlines/ Air India only. (Incase travel by any other air line, a certificate stating that such flights are not available or tickets for scheduled journey is not available from Air India authorities only must be produced for reimbursement.)
- v. Airfare or 2nd AC train fare (as applicable) to and from international airport will be paid.
- vi. Any other transport as per actual will be aid by the cell.
- vii. A faculty is permitted to present two different papers in two consecutive conferences where the duration of stay from beginning of first conference to end of second conference is limited to 10days. The total expenses will be limited to IR 100,000/-.

C. Training abroad (Training abroad in Advanced Labs and on Management)

All clauses as stipulated in (B) above shall apply with following modifications

- i. No registration fee shall be paid for training in Advanced Laboratories.
- ii. For management training the training fee may be paid as per actual.
- iii. The total expenses for the training shall be limited to IR 1.50.000/-.
- iv. The total stay including the journey should be limited to 15days.
- v. If a faculty likes to attend a conference to present paper in a conference adjoining a training program he/ she can do so subjected to minimum one week of training and total period of stay limited to 2 weeks.
- vi. In above case the travel should be executed with single return air ticket with a stop over either during onward or return journey.

Note: In case a person receives any financial assistance from other sources, the TEQIP will bear the balance expenditure not exceeding IR 100,000/- for paper presentation and IR 1,50,000/- for attending training abroad.

In continuation of this Ministry's letter No.30-4/2000-TS.I dated 20th December," ·2001, the undersigned is directed to say that vide letter under reference this Ministry had issued guidelines on Policy Framework for Promotion of Post-Graduate Education & Research in Engineering & Technology.

- 2. La Under the Policy Framework for PG Education and Research the rate of scholarship for ME/M. Tech scholars and doctoral students were enhanced. Later the rate of emoluments for Junior Research Fellows (JRF) and Senior Research Fellows (SRF) was revised to a different level by Department of Science & Technology (DST), that Council for Scientific and industrial Research (CSIR), it was noticed that most of premier institutions have scholars funded through the Ministry of IIRD as well as through DST i CSIR and other agencies and differentials in rate of fellowships was causing difficulties and tension in these institutions.
- In order to resolve this anomalous situation, the Policy Framework for PG Education and Research have been reviewed in consultation with DST, CSIR, other-Departments, UGC, AICTE and premier academic institutions. While reviewing it was noted that the Council of IITs in its meeting in 1995 had decided that the enhancement of stipends or scholarships given to postgraduate students and research scholars by CSIR be applicable in IITs as well. It had further recommended that in future a unified decision by concerned Ministry / Departments and the UGC be taken. Based on detailed deliberations and consultations, the Government of India has in furtherance to the Policy Framework for PG Education and Research taken the following decisions:
- Assistantship for ME, M.Tech or MS (by research) programmes by the Ministry of HRD may be maintained at Rs.5000 per month as approved in the policy framework for PG education and research in December, 2001. However, the rate of scholarship for M.Tech-students need not maintain parity with Junior Research Fellowship (IRF) under the UGC /-CSIR. Contingency at a r. im (as already

approved in the policy framework) would be available to the Department to meet departmental expenses on research related activities for the postgraduate students. All students getting assistantship would be required to put in at least eight hours of teaching. research and other work in the Institute. Assistantship for MS (by research) could be extended to the third year on case-to-case basis by the Institute.

- b) The number of assistantship supported by Ministry of IRD for ME, M. Tech and MS (by Research) scholars shall be restricted to a number fixed by the Ministry. This shall be provided to the scholars on the basis of merit determined through GATE scores. B. Tech graduates from the III's getting a CGPA score of 8 or above (on a scale of 10) would also be entitled to the assistantship without having to appear in GATE. Deferred payment of assistantship may be resorted to wherever there is apprehension of scholars leaving the programs mid-way.
- c) Students of final year of dual degree integrated programmes would also be entitled to assistantship from the 9th semester onwards in case they get a CGPA score of 8 or above (on a scale of 10). Alternatively they could compete for assistantship through GATE. The number of ME, M. Tech scholars or students of dual degree programmes getting assistantship on the basis of CGPA scores would be included in the numbers of assistantship fixed by the Ministry of IRD. Information of these numbers will have to be provided to the Ministry annually.
 - d) Support for doctoral programmes by the Ministry of IIRD be termed as Research / Teaching Assistantship, the rate of this assistantship shall be enhanced to bring it to the DST/CSIR level. Contingency at a rate of Rs.20000 per annum per scholar (enhanced form Rs.10000 to bring parity-with CSIR system) would be available to the Departments of IITs to meet departmental expenses on research related activities for the doctoral students. All scholars getting Research / Teaching Assistantship would be required to put in at least eight hours of research or teaching in the Institute. Enhanced rates shall be as follows.

Qualifying degree	First 2 years	For next 2
BE/B.Tech./M.Sc. or Equivalent	Rs.8000 pm	Rs.9000 pm
ME / M. Tech. / MBBS or Equivalent	Rs.9500 pm	Rs.10000 pm

e) . The rate of fellowship for OIP scholars registered for Ph.D. programmes would also be enhanced to the DST/CSIR level.

The tuition fee for both post graduate (including final year students of dual degree programs) and research students in the HTs be reduced to Rs.5000 per annum with no provision for waiver except 100% waiver for SC / ST scholars.

g) Research / Teaching Assistantship for scholars at enhanced rate be restricted to 4 years as already approved in PG Policy Framework. All students in the first three years will automatically be covered under the revised scheme and scholars in 4th year may be

given an option either to continue at the pre-revised scale with a provision for extension by another year or opt for enhanced rate with 4-year time limit.

- h) ITs may appropriately allocate number of assistantships to the emerging and thrust areas in engineering.
- 3. The above decisions will be given effect from the next academic year i.e. 1st July, 2003.
- 4. It is advised that different provisions in the on going programmes/schemes for PG education & research may be suitably modified by all concerned to bring them in conformity with the above decisions. All Organizations / Institutions are advised to absorb the additional requirement of funds due to enhancement of assistanceship / research fellowship within their existing non-plan budgets.
