

**A. GENERAL AND PROCEDURAL MATTERS.**

**BOC-16(2008) - 1:** Welcome to all members and visitors to the meeting by the Chairman.  
Chairman welcomed all the members to the 16<sup>th</sup> meeting of the Board of Governors

**BOC-16(2008) - 2:** Confirmation of the minutes of the 15<sup>th</sup> Meeting of the BOC.  
The minutes of the 15<sup>th</sup> Meeting were sent to the members vide letter No. NITR/RUC/2008/1/54 dt.05.07.2008. A comment on the correctness of the recording has been received from Prof. U.K. Mohanty, Member.

The letter of Prof. U. K. Mohanty was discussed. The Board decided to delete the paragraph "the procedure for giving preference in promotion/appointment in the next higher grade to eligible internal candidates, who are found fit, will be framed by the Institute and the same will be put up for approval in the next BOC meeting" from the Minutes of 15<sup>th</sup> BOC vide clause No. BOC(15)(2007)-22. This will be replaced by the sentence "Preference in promotion/appointment in the next higher grade to eligible internal candidates, who are found fit, will be given over others".

**BOG-16(2008) - 5: Implementation of NIT Act.**

In accordance with NIT Act 2007, BOC, Senate, FC and BWC have been constituted as given in Annexure of agenda papers. The Board may nominate an External Board member for Finance Committee.

The BOC noted that the Board of Governors of NIT Rourkela has been constituted in accordance with the NIT Act 2007. Since statutes are not ready, the formation of Finance Committee and Building & Works Committee may be deferred. However, Director was authorized to constitute a temporary BWC for monitoring construction activities till the statutes are notified.

**B. POLICY AND IMPORTANT ADMINISTRATIVE MATTERS**

**BOG-16(2008)-6: Policy on Preference to internal candidates in recruitment and promotion.**

In view of the deletion of the paragraph under reference BOC-16(2008)-2, the above proposal was deferred. It was decided that recruitment will be made as per existing recruitment rules of the Institute. Wherever rules are not framed, Government rules will be applicable. However, Director was advised to seek opinion from the Internal Board members, employees and MHRD, and submit a proposal for amendment of the recruitment rules with reference to giving preference to internal candidates in recruitment/promotion.

**BOG-16(2008)-7: Enhancement of sanctioned Faculty Strength.**

The Board approved, in principle, enhancement of sanctioned faculty strength as per sanctioned students strength and student to faculty ratio of 12 : 1 as directed by the Government. The Board advised the administration to calculate the faculty strength as per the new formula. The student strength should reflect the present sanctioned strength, increase in intake due to implementation of OBC reservation and approved new Departments. The consolidated data will be sent by the Director to MHRD for concurrence. The final student and faculty structure will be reported to the Board in its next meeting.

**BOG-16(2008)-8: Faculty Recruitment.**

As per decision of the BOC, faculty positions have been advertised. A copy of the advertisement is presented as annexure for information and approval of the Board.

A suggested list of subject experts will be placed on the table for approval of BOC as BOC nominates in various selection committees. The Board is requested to approve the list with additions/deletions as it think fit.

*Adult*

As per MHRD guidelines, the HOD is a member of the selection committee. In some departments the HOD is an Assistant Professor or Lecturer. It is suggested that in such cases he/ she will not be included in the Committee for a post higher than his/ her own. One of the Deans may be nominated by the Director to participate in his place.

In addition to open posts, there shall be interview for CAS.

The Board noted the contents of the advertisement for faculty position and advised to fill up all the vacancies and to create panels for the additional posts expected to be created with approval of MHRD vide item BOC-16 (2008)-7. The panel of experts for all the departments was approved except new departments. The Chairman BOC was authorized to approve the list (submitted by the Director) on behalf of the Board.

**BOG-16(2008)- 9: Recruitment of Essential Non-Faculty staff for the Institute as an Institution of National Importance under NIT Act.**

The Regional Engineering College (REC), Banskela was an affiliated college set up in 1961 with only UG programmes. The staff structure, in both numbers and quality, was worked out accordingly. With conversion to NIT and its changed objective of composite UG, PG and Research programmes, this staff structure is proving inadequate. It was proposed to adopt a non-teaching staff structure that is more suitable to an Institute of advanced learning.

The Board discussed the agenda and resolved that:

The Director will send a request to MHRD seeking approval for non-faculty staff positions conforming to the following norms:

- 1) Student to faculty ratio of 12 : 1.
- 2) Faculty to non-faculty staff ratio of 1 : 1.1

The Ministry was requested by the Board to consider the Institute's difficulties and to expedite approval of the new positions and other guidelines. The Board approved in principle recruitment of staff and officers as per structure and norms approved by the Ministry.

The Board, vide its resolution No BOC-15(2008)- 22 dt 11.01.2008, had authorized the administration to make recruitment to 7 essential Technical posts. The Board was informed that applications for the said posts have been received, and processing is under way. The administration was advised to proceed with the recruitment.

3. Financial assistance up to Rs. 1 lakh once in 3 year for attending International conferences either for presenting a paper, chairing a session or otherwise deputed by the Institute as per Institute guidelines. An additional amount of Rs. 50,000/- to be given from the SRICCE fund to the faculty members who is the Principal Investigator of a Project amounting at least Rs. 15,00,000/-.
4. Reimbursement of 100% of membership fee of one professional society every year subject to a maximum amount of Rs. 5000/-, and reimbursement of cost of purchase of books / journals up to Rs. 4000/- per annum.
5. Reimbursement of telephone charges up to 500 units per month both office & residence together.
6. Reimbursement of relocation charges from within India to faculty members at the time of their joining as per Government rules.
7. Interest free soft advance of Rs. 50,000/- to the newly recruited faculty members at the level of Lecturer or Asst. Professor. An agreement will be signed for the same.
8. Honorarium of Rs. 10,000/- per month for 2 years to the teachers who obtain Bhatnagar Award, fellowship of national academy or a young Scientist award of national academy.

The Board noted that many of the above facilities are likely be considered along with the pay reforms of the forthcoming Pay Commission. The existing reimbursement scheme such as professional society fee, book grant and telephone charges and other facilities will continue as per the existing practice of the Institute.

In addition, the Board approved reimbursement of relocation charges within India at the time of joining as per Government of India Transfer rules and practices followed in IITs.

**B) Next BOG Meeting .**

The date of next meeting of Board of Governors will be due in July, 2008. The date will be finalized in consultation with Chairman, BOG.

**BOG-16(2008)-10: New Appraisal System for staff, officers and faculty of NIT Rourkela.**

The BOG vide resolution No BOG-15(2008)-18 dt.11.01.2008 directed the administration to evolve a meaningful Appraisal System for staff, Officers and Faculty of NIT Rourkela by taking expert advice. Accordingly on the advice Director, NIM Bhubaneswar, Prof. S. Ganesh of NIMB has been engaged as a consultant to design the Appraisal System. The work is in progress and the report is likely to be submitted by 15<sup>th</sup> May, 2008.

The Board appreciated the initiative for designing new appraisal system for staff, officers and faculty of the Institute. It was discussed that the proposed appraisal system will help in increased accountability and responsibility of the employees. This will also help in improved performance removing subjectivity from the existing appraisal system. The final report will be submitted in the next BOG meeting.

**BOG-16(2008)-11: Regularization of Land Records.**

260.44 hectare of Land have been registered in the name of National Institute of Technology, Rourkela. The R.O.R. has been corrected by Tahasildar, Rourkela and the same was issued to N.I.T., Rourkela on 26<sup>th</sup> January, 2008. Plot numbers of the land are given in the annexure.

The Board noted with appreciation the regularization of 260.44 hectare of land in the name of NIT., Rourkela.

**C. ACADEMIC MATTERS**

**BOG -16(2008)-12: Central Sector Scholarship Scheme of top class Education for SC/ST , students.**

The Ministry of social Justice and Empowerment and Ministry of Tribal Affairs of the Government of India, New Delhi have introduced a new scholarship scheme for Top Class Education for meritorious SC & ST students in the year 12007 - 08. NIT, Rourkela is one among 127 selected Institutions / Colleges for the same. Accordingly the Ministry of social justice have sanctioned Rs.10,24,760/- and Rs.5,27,000/- towards grants-in-aid for the said scholarship for SC and ST students respectively. As per their requirement a bond in favor of the President of India has to be executed by the members of the Governing Body of the Institute for releasing the grant-in-aid. The committee is expected look after all affairs relating to this scheme.

**Salient features of the Scheme:**

1. Ten SC and five ST 1<sup>st</sup> year B.Tech students of NIT Rourkela have been selected on the basis of AIEEE rank for the scholarship.

2. Each student will get more than Rs.1 lakh per year towards expenses relating to tuition fee and other Institution fees, living expenses, books and a computer.
3. Post Metric Scholarship shall not be given to the awardees of this scholarship.
4. The scholarship amount will be released by the Ministry on yearly basis.
5. The scholarship, once awarded, will continue till the completion of the course subject to satisfactory performance.

Because the Ministry's urgent demand, the Director has accepted the offer on behalf of the Board. The Board is requested to accord post facto its approval to receiving the scholarship for SC/ST students.

The Board approved, post facto, the proposal for signing an agreement with Ministry of Tribal Affairs of the Government of India, New Delhi for SC/ ST scholarship.

##### BOG-16(2005)- 15: TEQIP- Revised allocation of funds, and limited extension of duration.

In the last Joint Review Meeting of TEQIP held at Ranchi on 02.02.2008, it was informed that due to appreciation of Indian rupee and diversion of TEQIP funds towards National Calamity fund, the total TEQIP budget for NIT Rourkela was reduced to 15.27% cr against the original sanction of Rs.17 cr. In various earlier TEQIP review meetings, the Institute was advised that more funds would be released as and when the purchase orders were finalized. The TEQIP program has been formally extended till 31<sup>st</sup> December, 2008 with limited fund allocation for staff training and community service. The Institute had proposed to meet expenses on the equipment needed for the new department of Biotechnology and Medical Engineering, the Central Workshops and a few essential major equipment from TEQIP funds which did not materialise. The equipment will be procured from Plan Funds. The additional amount will be met from the Plan Fund of the Institute.

The Board noted the above proposal and approved that the equipment which are not covered under TEQIP will be procured from Institute Plan Grant.

**BOG-16(2008)-16: Promotion of Prof. K. K. Khatua, Lecturer (SS), CE as Asst. Professor**

Shri K. K. Khatua, Lecturer (SS), Department of Civil Engineering was interviewed by the duly constituted selection Committee in April, 2007 for the post of Assistant Professor. The Selection Committee recommended Shri Khatua for the post of Asst. Professor, Department of Civil Engineering from the date of award of his Ph.D. degree, which should be before 31.12.2007. The recommendation of the selection committee was accepted by the Board and Sri Khatua was informed accordingly. Shri Khatua submitted his Ph.D. thesis on 17.10.2007 to NIT, Rourkela and was awarded Ph.D. degree on 11<sup>th</sup> March, 2008. On submission of his Ph.D. degree certificate, he has been given the post of Asst. Professor provisionally w.e.f. 11.03.2008 subject to the concurrence of BOG. The BOG's decision shall rest on extension of date from 31<sup>st</sup> December to 11<sup>th</sup> March.

The Board decided that Prof. Khatua will be reverted to the position of Lecturer (SG) and needs to appear before the Selection Committee to be held in the month May, 2008 for appointment as Assistant Professor. In future, only candidates who obtain Ph.D. degree before June 30<sup>th</sup>, i.e. the day before the date when all appointments are made effective, will be considered for selection as Assistant Professor. No extension beyond June 30<sup>th</sup> shall be permitted.

**BOG-16(2008)-17: Cancellation of Lien of Prof. R. Baliyarsingh, AP of CS Department.**

Prof. Rameswar Baliyar Singh, Asst. Professor, Department of Computer Science & Engineering of this Institute was granted Lien for a period of one year from 14.04.2008 to 13.04.2009 to join as Professor in the P.G. Department of Information and Communication technology of Fakir Mohan University, Balasore. He has applied to cancel sanction of Lien in view of his personal difficulty.

As per Govt. of India Letter No. F 19-20/2005-IFD dated 22.02.2006 vide clause (ii) " the employees who entered into service on or before 31.12.2003 and were governed by the CPF scheme are not eligible for switch over to the GPF-cum-Pension scheme. They will continue to be governed by the CPF scheme.

It may, however, be noted that the employees were in the CPF scheme under the State Government and have come under the ambit of Central Government for the first time. In view of the major change which they did not anticipate, they have requested special consideration.

The Board advised the Director to write a letter to MHRD seeking permission for conversion from CPF to Pension scheme, and to follow directives of the Ministry.

**BOG-16(2008)- 20: Any other item with the permission of the Chair**

**A) Academic reimbursements and other incentives for faculty members**

1. Initial grant up to a maximum limit of Rs. 5 lakhs for carrying out research projects.
2. Institute will support one National Conference and 50% of travel cost of 2 more conferences for presenting paper, chairing a session or being otherwise deputied by the Institute. In the 2 conferences where 50% cost is reimbursed, the balance may be taken from research projects or from outside sponsors. There is no limit on conferences which are fully paid from research grants.

Normally travel cost will be limited to twice the AC-2 Tier fare to encourage booking cheaper options in airline ticket structure.

Faculty members will be discouraged from attending conferences outside vacation days.

3. Financial assistance up to Rs. 1 lakh once in 3 year for attending International conferences either for presenting a paper, chairing a session or otherwise deputed by the Institute as per Institute guidelines. An additional amount of Rs. 50,000/- to be given from the SRICCE fund to the faculty members who is the Principal Investigator of a Project amounting at least Rs. 15,00,000/-
4. Reimbursement of 100% of membership fee of one professional society every year subject to a maximum amount of Rs. 5000/-, and reimbursement of cost of purchase of books / journals up to Rs. 4000/- per annum.
5. Reimbursement of telephone charges up to 500 units per month both office & residence together.
6. Reimbursement of relocation charges from within India to faculty members at the time of their joining as per Government rules.
7. Interest free soft advance of Rs. 50,000/- to the newly recruited faculty members at the level of Lecturer or Asst. Professor. An agreement will be signed for the same.
8. Honorarium of Rs. 10,000/- per month for 2 years to the teachers who obtain Bhatnagar Award, fellowship of national academy or a young Scientist award of national academy.

The Board noted that many of the above facilities are likely be considered along with the pay reforms of the forthcoming Pay Commission. The existing reimbursement scheme such as professional society fee, book grant and telephone charges and other facilities will continue as per the existing practice of the Institute.

In addition, the Board approved reimbursement of relocation charges within India at the time of joining as per Government of India Transfer rules and practices followed in IITs.

The date of next meeting of Board of Governors will be due in July, 2008. The date will be finalized in consultation with Chairman, BOG.







The undersigned is directed to say that many NITs had sought the permission of the Ministry to induct faculties in the light of enhanced enrolment of the students which has taken place after their conversions as Deemed Universities. The issue of recruitment of faculty in NITs has been under consideration of the Ministry for quite sometime and it has now been decided that, based on the already approved norm of AICTE relating to teacher student ratio of 1:10 for PG programmes and 1:15 for UG programmes, the NITs may recruit faculties on direct recruitment basis with the approval of their respective FCs & BOBs after taking into account availability of fund for the purpose. The ratio among Professors, Assistant Professors and Lecturers should be 1:2:4.

It is also clarified while the qualification and experience prescribed by AICTE for recruitment of faculty provides for minimum threshold limit for Degree level institutes. NITs being national level Institutes, each Board may prescribe a higher threshold limit with regard to such criteria keeping in view the practices being followed in this regard in other National level Institutes like Indian Institutes of Technology (IITs) & Indian Institute of Science (IISc), Bangalore.

KNOW ALL MEN BY THESE PRESENTS THAT we the Board of Governors of National Institute of Technology, Rourkela, an Institute of National Importance functioning under the NIT Act 2007 (hereinafter called the Obligor/Obligors) are held and firmly bound to the President of India (Hereinafter called the Government) in the sum of Rs.10,24,760/- (Rupees Ten lakhs Twenty four Thousand Seven Hundred Sixty only) with interest therein @ 10% per annum well and truly to be paid to the President on demand and without demur, for which payment we bind ourselves and our successors and assigns by these presents.

2. SIGNED this 20<sup>th</sup> day of March in the year Two Thousand and eight.

3. WHEREAS the obligors has sent a request proposal to Government, through the Union Ministry of Social Justice and Empowerment for Grants of Rs.10,24,760/- vide his letter number 11017/53/2007.SCD-I dated 21.01.2008, the obligors has agreed to execute this bond in advance, in favor of Union Ministry of Social Justice and Empowerment for entire amount of Rs.10,24,760/- as requested in the proposal sent to Government. The obligor is willing to accept the proposed amount or any other amount approved/sanctioned by the Government. The obligor is willingly executing this bond of proposed amount with the stipulation that obligor will be bound up to this amount or by the actual amount approved/sanctioned by the Government, whichever is less.
